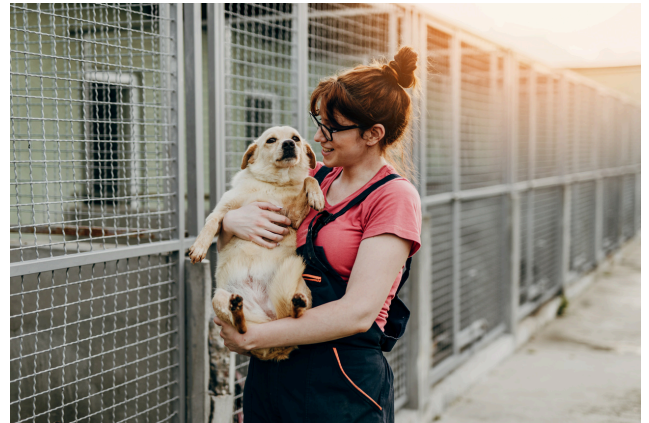


# BRINGING YOUR RESCUE DOG HOME



Giving a rescue dog a second chance is one of the most rewarding thing you can do. Once you have found the right dog for you make sure you are ready for your new life together with our top tips.



To avoid any extra stress make sure you have all the things you need before you bring your new dog home. Speak to rescue to find out about any extra needs or favourites treats, toys etc

# I need space!

Give your new friend a bit of time to get to know their new surroundings. Allow them their own space and time to get acclimatised. Keep things calm and quiet and let them tell you when they are ready for contact. Have their favourite treats ready for them when they want to interact.



## Safety first

Make sure you have well fitting & appropriate equipment such as a collar/harness and lead.

Put tags onto your dogs collar and harness.

Make sure you change the microchip into your name with correct details.

DON'T let your new dog straight off the lead, so many new rescues go missing within the first few days. Hire secure field to start and build the bond with the dog first. Seek help for training if needed.

Introduce other pets and new people slowly. Make sure you don't overwhelm them with too many new visitors.

Create a routine for your dog that works for the whole household. A routine will help them settle quicker and feel more secure.
